Job Description

Job title: Outreach Practitioner (37.5 hours a week – Option of Term Time + 1 week)

Purpose of Job: To provide high quality, effective support to schools and families and promote positive outcomes for children and young people with complex needs.

Key Job Outcomes:

- Children and young people, on caseload, to achieve and learn to their full learning and participation potential.
- Children on caseload feel safe, enjoy their home or school and make a positive contribution
- Families and schools developing their understanding of the nature of neurodiversity and complex needs.

Main Responsibilities:

- Plan, develop and deliver interventions for individuals and groups of children and young people in schools and families, across Norfolk and Suffolk and via online platforms.
- Monitor and report progress of pupils on caseload to Team Lead and demonstrate the effectiveness of support.
- Provide support to schools and families in order to improve outcomes of children and young people with diverse and complex needs.
- Attend regular meetings with the Team Lead and other colleagues.
- Attend regular supervision sessions with the Team Lead and be responsible for being proactive in self reflection and continuous development.
- Demonstrate effectiveness and the efficient use of resources.
- Comply with Alpha Inclusion regulations and policies to ensure safe and professional practice.
- Creation of teaching resources.
- On occasion, the transportation of children and young people.
- The driving of The Block Bus (a converted vehicle) and delivery of interventions on the vehicle and remotely.
- Contribute to the culture and support of the small team, carrying out other duties as needed as requested by the Team Lead or Office Manager.



- Commit to ongoing personal and professional development to ensure services remain effective and up-to-date with current practice and legislation.

Required Conditions:

Alpha Inclusion and Communication is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and young people and expects all staff and volunteers to share in this commitment.
